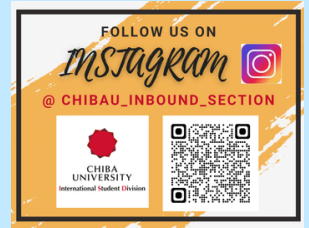


Hi, this is ISD. Here's our monthly newsletter for international students. We've given it a fresh new look starting this month!

Visa Status Change Required for Post-Graduation Employment in Japan

International students who plan to work in Japan after graduating must change their visa status from "Student" to "Work." You can apply for this change with a Certificate of Expected Graduation, but when receiving your new residence card, you must present a Certificate of Graduation. If your diploma is not yet available, bring the original degree certificate (学位記 Gakuiki) and a copy instead.

Watch Out for Fake Police or Immigration Calls and Emails!

There have been reports of solicitation by religious groups and phone scams involving individuals posing as police officers. Religious solicitation often begins with friendly conversations or invitations to events. If you are not interested, decline firmly. In phone scams, callers may claim you are involved in a crime to create fear. Please note: police will never ask for personal information such as your residence card details or money over the phone. If you encounter suspicious individuals or calls, contact people around you or the university's consultation desk.
