Advanced Japanese Courses Now Available for Graduate Students!

Chiba University offers Japanese language courses for international students who wish to improve their skills. From this academic year, graduate students (regular students) can now enroll in advanced-level classes (Japanese 700 and 800). If you are looking to master the high-level Japanese required for writing academic papers and giving presentations, we highly encourage you to consider these courses. For JP Bank Account Holders

- *Update your residence card information When you renew your residence card, you must report the new expiration date to JP Bank. If you don't, you will not be able to send or withdraw money after the registered date. You can complete the process using the "Yucho Tetsuzuki App" available in 12 languages.
- *Change your account status to "Resident" When you first arrive in Japan, your account is "non-resident," which means that all transfers are treated as expensive international transfers and you cannot apply for a credit card. After being in Japan for more than 6 months, you can change your status to "resident." You can then send money from ATMs and apply for a credit card. To change your status, please apply at JP Bank counter.

Scholarship Registration for Self-Financed International Students (Fall Semester 2025)

Registration for scholarship applicants for the Fall Semester of 2025 will be held Oct 1-15th. Starting 2025, registration is required every semester. Even if you registered in April, you must register again in October if you wish to apply for scholarships in fall. For more details see \rightarrow ISD website.
